** <b>IF YOU ARE DIABETIC:</b> and take Glucophage, Glucovance, or Metformin, <b>DO NOT</b> take the morning of your procedure or 2 days after the procedure. If you take only oral medications, and your procedure is scheduled before 12:00 noon, do not take them the morning of your procedure. If you take only <u>oral</u> medication and your procedure is scheduled for 12:00 noon or AFTER, you may eat a light breakfast at 6:00 am and take your <u>oral</u> medications. Please notify our staff for all types of diabetic medications. Some medications may need to be held or changed around the time of your procedure. If you take <b>INSULIN</b> , you may take ½ of your normal insulin dose the morning of your procedure.					
** <b>IF YOU ARE HAVING A RENAL ARTERIOGRAM:</b> Please remember <u>NOT</u> to take your hig blood pressure medication(s) the morning of the procedure.

## POST ABDOMINAL AORTIC ANEURSYM INSTRUCTIONS

- Some discomfort, bruising and soreness is to be expected following the procedure. If you are bleeding, or have severe pain, call 911 or go to the nearest emergency room.
- Light activity and no heavy lifting for 2 weeks.
- You may resume your pre-procedure medication schedule.
- Keep the incision area dry and clean for 5 days following the procedure
- Keep all follow-up appointments with our office and your referring physician
- No driving for 2 weeks
